GOOD LUCK TO ALL LIVESTOCK SHOW PARTICIPANTS

Livestock Show Concession Stand

All 4-H members are asked to bring a 24 pack of Coke, Diet Coke, Sprite, Dr. Pepper, Diet Dr. Pepper or water. (Dr. Pepper is probably the best seller). We are also asking each member to bring a pan of <u>uncut</u> brownies or rice krispie treats or 2 dozen 2" **Homemade** Cookies. Please do not cut or package your baked goods. <u>Please bring your baked goods on Thursday.</u> If possible please bring your baked goods in a disposable pan.

All 4-H members and parents are asked to work a shift in the concession stand. We will be doing a sign up sheet through the internet (sign up genius) for shifts. Sign up available around the 15th of January. All times are on a first come first serve basis. Please note that you cannot be excused from school to work concession stand—unless you are showing and already excused from school.

Money earned in the concession stand helps to pay for entry fees for district contests (~\$15 per person), camps (1/2 the fee up to \$150), and state round up. This is currently the only fund raiser the parent leaders have to pay for these expenses.

Clothing Project

In the Clothing/Textiles project there are many different competitions:

<u>Duds to Dazzle</u>— In this competition, teams of 4-H members will re-design and repurpose discarded garments. **April 1st**

Fashion Show— In this project you will learn Clothing construction, comparison shopping and recycling/embellishing. This project is done individually. There are several categories in this competition. District May 2nd

Fashion Storyboard— This is an industry-inspired method of displaying original designs. "Tells the story" of the designer's idea. Includes original illustrations and flats, as well as items that have influenced the design. Categories in this competition are Wearable: clothing that can be worn; Accessory, includes items such as belts, purses, bags, hats etc.; Jewelry includes necklaces, rings, bracelets and earrings; Non-Wearable, pillows, stuffed animals items for the home, etc.; Pet clothing, clothing that can be worn by a pet or other animal.

District May 2nd

Trashion Fashion—This competition allows 4-H members to use their design skills to create and exhibit a recycled-reused garment created from items that would otherwise be thrown in the trash. This project is uploaded on youtube for competition. April 1st deadline.

Reminders:

- You should be worming your swine every 30 to 45 days. Check your wormers for withdrawal dates.
- The weather has been dry and cold this can affect the condition of your pigs' skin. Be sure to take care of their skin.
- Winter is gearing up with some days being extremely cold; your pigs will need adequate bedding to keep warm.
 Keep their bedding clean and plentiful.
- Cold nights mean frozen water. Make sure they have access to plenty of fresh water.
- Make sure your grades are all passing. 4-H abides by the UIL rules—no pass no play.
- The office will send out grade checks the week of Livestock Show. If you're not sure of your grade in a class it's best to check now and make sure you are passing!

We will be needing a new project leader so if you are interested in helping please call the Extension Office and let me know!




Are you interested in shooting? Do you want to improve your skills or learn how to shoot? Shooting Sports is a great way to learn these skills in a safe and fun environment.
